

# We Had a Face-lift!

Oakwood is a beautiful church! A year ago, we said we were sagging a little and needed a face-lift. You will recall that we are 32 years old and just like your own home some things need repaired or replaced; things that we delayed because of our focus on paying off the debt. In addition our technology costs are always increasing.

So, we took a special offering last September and raised \$20,000. With this money and other kind donations, here is what we accomplished:

- Replace two projectors in the sanctuary
- Added fabric and rock to the south bank to eliminate annual mulching and reduce erosion
- Replaced carpet and painted in office area and hallways
- Replaced cracked toilet in women's restroom
- Painted interior walls; narthex area, office, hallways and other areas
- Restriped the parking lots

The Lord has blessed us with many congregants who built this church and then gave generously of their time and money to pay off our debt. We thank the Lord for that generosity.



- Our church was built in 1992
- A remodel was completed in 2004
- Part of our church is 32 years old, the newer part is 21 years old
- Our church is 28, 000 square feet sitting on 4.2 acres of ground

**Greeters.** Each week a request for greeters is sent out via CCB. You will notice that we have greeters to be stationed at the front door and the main sanctuary door. Be sure to sign up even if it is just you. One is better than none.


# Wednesday Night Suppers Starting September 11



We continue to plan for Wednesday night meals. These meals have proven to be an important part of the energy on Wednesday nights at Oakwood with great fellowship. We are so grateful to the individuals, groups and families who have done this in the past and are continuing this year. Thank you to those who have already volunteered to prepare a meal.

Right now, we have 3 groups who will be doing the meal once a month. We need one more family or small group. Please remember that the meals should be simple and any expenses you incur

- **Operating Fund Income:** July 2024 had regular offerings of \$22,554.97 (-\$2,233.43 from last month) and capital fund offerings of \$805.69 (+\$112.24 from last month) for total offerings of \$23,360.66 (-\$2,121.19 from last month).
- **Operating Fund Expenses:** Total operating expenses were \$41,157.30 (+\$2,002.40 from last month).
- **Operating Fund Net Income:** -\$17,796.64 (regular offerings and regular capital fund offerings minus operating expenses). **Our expenses exceeded our income in July.**

# A Word from Our Lay Leader

Do you think God makes mistakes? Most of us would say no.

But do we truly believe that? I mean, how often do we pray for something, it does not happen **exactly** as we wanted, and we wonder what is wrong with God that it didn't work out the "right way?"

Over the years, I have often prayed for things that did happen. Starr was cured of cancer - though I was not too happy she had to go through all she did. Our kids grew up and have been successful - though there were many struggles along the way.

What I have had to learn was when God's answers did come, it often wasn't exactly the answer I was looking for. In effect, I

wanted things to work out a certain way and God seemed to ignore my "perfect" plans and often sent me a different direction.



I have had to learn to accept those better plans. For example, years ago I was offered a job in a school district that had major problems – problems I did not want to have to deal with. I was going to withdraw my application but Starr, who never wanted to move, told me to leave my name in the mix. They offered me the position. Didn't God know that was not a good fit? Ultimately, I decided to trust that was where we were supposed to go and it turned out to be a great place where we were able to accomplish some good things.

But what was God thinking when I got prostate cancer? I mean, my Dad had it so I expected to get it. I was cured and didn't have to keep up treatments like he did. Still – surgery and radiation treatments were no fun...

Then I got the Alzheimer's diagnosis. My Dad had it so I again expected it, but it still made no sense and must be a mistake... But God had other plans.

After a couple infusions, Starr and I were asked by my neurologist, Dr. Shah, to lead a support group for those with the disease and their families. It continues to grow. We have been with Dr. Shah on the radio and TV talking about the need for early detection and treatment. We have had the privilege of talking to groups and individuals about the drug I am receiving and the effect of the disease on families. Always, we try to emphasize hope, early detection, and treatment.

Each of these reminds me I don't see nor understand the big picture. That is, I see what I want. God sees the way to help others.

I keep trying to remind myself when things don't seem to go the way I WANT, then maybe God has a different plan. If I am honest, God's plan always ends up being better than anything I could have planned.

Still, if God would only listen to me about some current issues.... Guess I am still a slow learner. Doyle Scott






