Our When God Calls sermon series will wrap up on the first Sunday of August. Then the series will be as follows:



Mark Your Calendar!



June 2024 Finances

Operating Fund Income: June 2024 had regular offerings of \$24,788.40 (-\$2,877.86 from last month) and capital fund offerings of \$693.45 (-\$44.31 from last month) for total offerings of \$25,481.85 (+\$2,922.17 from last month).

Operating Fund Expenses: Total operating expenses were \$56,192.72 (-\$59.00 from last month). Paying for our campers and the recent painting and carpeting are not part of the Church Monthly Operating Expenses.

Operating Fund Net Income: -\$30,710.87 (regular offerings and regular capital fund offerings minus operating expenses). Actual Operating Fund Net Income is -\$13,673.25 (-\$429.45 from last month's expenses). Our expenses exceeded our income in June.

A Word from our Lay Leader

I recently read that three generations from now there will be a record of our lives, but no one will know who we really had been.



I have done work on the family history of both of my parents. That has led to a family tree with over 3400 people and lots of interesting facts and finds. Starr also has lots of her family information and can trace many of her relatives to the Netherlands.

Because of our interest, each year Starr and I make trips to put flowers on the graves of some of our ancestors including many we knew -- and some who died long before we were born.

Some might wonder why we do that. We both say because it was important to our parents. I remember my mother commenting that "leaving flowers on a grave lets people know someone remembers them."

Growing up, I always enjoyed the stories my elders told. For example, my maternal great grandmother thought her 19-year-old daughter (my grandmother) was too young to raise her daughter (my mother). So, my mother spent lots of time, including summers, with her grandmother.

In later years, my mother told us stories of her grandmother leaving in the middle of the night and then the next morning reporting on a baby that she either delivered or helped the doctor deliver.

Sadly, we know in a few years all those stories will be forgotten. But I know there is a way our legacy can live on forever. We can do that by helping others. For example, in my career I have seen staff members (whether teachers, support staff, or others) who gave a young person some attention and support. That little push was key to a change in

their path. That student decided to go the right way and had a successful life as a result.

Think of how often you have heard a person mention someone who



helped them change. Often that person literally turned away from what they were doing and ultimately became a successful member of society. We know doctors, pastors, and others change people's lives. Probably all of us have done something that saved another person.

Three generations from now, few if any will remember anything about each of us. But, if we help others, our impact can be felt by them, their children, their children's children...

So, while our name may be long lost, our impact can be felt for generations to come.
